San Francisco 49ers vs. St. Louis Rams Game Notes Sunday, December 4, 2011

With the win...

- San Francisco clinched the NFC West Division title for the first time since 2002.
- Head Coach **Jim Harbaugh** joins George Seifert (1989) and Steve Mariucci (1997) as the only rookie head coaches in 49ers history to win the NFC West Division in their first year as head coaches.
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, San Francisco joins the Seattle Seahawks (2005) as the only teams to clinch the NFC West Division title after Week 13, the earliest the title has been won.
- The 49ers also became the quickest team to win their division in the NFL after Week 13 since the Indianapolis Colts clinched the AFC South in Week 12 in 2009. That same year the New Orleans Saints clinched the NFC South in Week 13.
- The 49ers improved to 10-0 in their last 10 home games against teams from the NFC West.
- The 49ers evened up the all-time series with Rams at 61-61-2, including 31-31-1 at Candlestick Park.

Points Are Hard To Come By

- The 49ers registered their first shutout of the season and their first since 10/4/09 vs. St. Louis (35-0).
- The 49ers defense ranks 1st in the NFL, allowing just 13.4 points per game. The 13.4 points per game allowed ranks 1st in franchise history.

- Dating back to last season, the **49ers defense** has not allowed a rushing TD in 13 consecutive games, which ranks t-1st in team history.

- The **49ers defense** is the only team in the NFL to not allow a rushing TD in the first 12 games of the 2011 season. The current 12-game streak to not allow a rushing TD ranks 1st in the NFL since 1970.

- The **49ers defense** has not allowed a TD in the first half in each of the past 6 games, which is the longest streak in franchise history.

Run Defense Continues Streak

- The **49ers run defense** has not allowed a 100-yd. rusher in the last 34 games, which marks the longest active streak in the NFL. Since the start of the 2000 season, the 49ers streak of 34 games without allowing a 100-yd rusher ranks 3rd in the NFL.

Knocking It Out

- The **49ers defense** registered 4 PDs on the day vs. the Rams, giving them 84 for the season. The 84 PDs rank 1st in the NFL this season.

- The team is on pace to record 112 PDs on the season, which would be tied for the 2nd most by the team since the stat was first tracked in 1991 (120 PDs – 1998, 112 PDs – 1993, and 110 PDs - 1995).

Nowhere To Run

- The **49ers defense** limited the Rams to just 31 yds. rushing and did not allow a rushing first down. This marked the first time the 49ers defense did not allow a rushing first down since 11/29/10 at Arz.
- The 31 rushing yds. allowed are the fewest by the 49ers since 11/29/10 at Arz. (13 rushing yds. allowed).

Frankly The Best

- RB **Frank Gore** (7,396) passed 49ers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Joe Perry (7,344) for most rushing yds. in franchise history. Gore broke the record on a 2-yd. run in the 2nd qtr. and finished the day with 73 yds. on 21 carries.

Going Deep

- QB **Alex Smith** completed 17 of 23 pass atts. for 274 yds., 2 TDs and a QB rating of 142.3, setting a new single-game career-high. He also registered TD passes of 52 yds. and 56 yds., marking the first time of his career that he's had two, 50-plus yd. TD passes in the same game. It also marks the second time Smith has registered two, 50-plus yd. completions in the same game (9/17/06 vs. StL – 72 yd. TD to WR Antonio Bryant; 56 yd. to WR Arnaz Battle).
- **Smith** connected with WR Michael Crabtree on a 52-yd. TD pass in the 3rd qtr. This marked Crabtree's 2nd TD receipt. of the season and his longest receipt. since 12/26/10 at StL (60-yd. TD from QB Troy Smith).
- **Smith** found WR **Kyle Williams** on a 56-yd. TD in the 4th qtr., marking the longest play from scrimmage this year. This was Williams' 3rd TD of the season and 3rd of his career.

Home Cooking

- Since 12/1/10, QB **Alex Smith** has completed 145 of 234 atts. for 1,964 yds., 16 TDs, 3 INTs and a QB rating of 106.4 when playing at home. He has also posted a 8-1 record.

Applying Pressure

- The **49ers defense** registered 4.0 sacks on the day, giving them 29.0 for the season.
- LB **Aldon Smith** registered 2.0 sacks on the day, giving him a team-high 9.5 sacks on the season. This marked his 3rd game with at least 2.0 sacks.
- Smith's 9.5 sacks ranks 3rd in franchise history for the most sacks by a rookie (12.5 by DT Charles Haley – 1986; 10.5 by DT Dana Stubblefield – 1993).
- Smith also ranks 2nd in the NFL for the most sacks among rookies, trailing Den. LB Von Miller – 10.5.
- DT **Ray McDonald** registered his first career FF after taking down Rams QB A.J. Feeley in the 2nd qtr., marking his 4th sack of the season and 9th of his career. The loose ball was recovered by LB **Aldon Smith** for his first career FR.
- LB **Larry Grant** recorded his first sack as a 49er and the 4th of his career.

Feeling Picky

- S **Dashon Goldson** tied his career high with his 4th INT of the season and 9th of his career.

Kicking Machine

- K **David Akers** connected on 4 of 4 of FGs on the day, giving him 32 made FGs on the season. He became the all-time leader for the most FGs in a single season in franchise history, passing K Jeff Wilkins (30 FGs in 1996).

Extending Their Streaks

- TE/LS **Brian Jennings** has now played in 188 consecutive games.
- DT **Justin Smith** has now started 167 consecutive games, dating back to his rookie season in 2001. Smith's consecutive start streak ranks 3rd among defensive players and 5th among all NFL players.
- TE **Vernon Davis** has now started 71 consecutive games, which ranks 3rd in the NFL among TE's behind Tony Gonzalez (82) and Jason Witten (79).

Question inaudible:

“You have to keep on-the-field separate from what we’re doing with building the stadium. I don’t want to put that pressure on the team. That’s not their responsibility. Their responsibility is to get better each and every day. I think we have done that for the most part this season and it culminated in winning the division and there’s still a long way for us to go.”

What does it feel like to say you’re a division winner?

“It feels great. I don’t know that it sunk in for everybody yet, but I asked the guys today, ‘You know this isn’t the last hat and t-shirt that I want.’ There’s a long way for us to go and there’s a lot of work that we need to do if we want to get there.”

You don’t want to see it stop? You want to see them keep going?

“No, we can’t let up. Arizona next week, you have to be prepared. Sometimes celebrating this early isn’t always a good thing, and we need to make sure that we keep our heads down, we keep focus and we keep moving forward.”

Jed, when you hired Jim Harbaugh to be your coach, did he give you a timeline on when you guys might be a playoff contender?

“When you start setting timelines and things like that, I don’t believe that’s a healthy relationship and a healthy forum for success. What we wanted to do was to make sure that our general manager and our head coach were on the same page and make sure that trickles down. I think that’s where we are right now. But, again there’s a long way for us to go.”

With a 10-2 record do you feel like you have accomplished a great deal thus far?

“We’ve hit our first milestone by winning the division, but again there’s a long way for us to go. Even at 10-2, there are things that we can do a lot better on-the-field and off-the-field. That’s what we are going to be working on starting on tomorrow.”

Jed, were you in college that last time the Niners won the division?

“Yes.”

What year were you?

“I was a junior.”

Do you remember where you were when they won the division or anything like that?

”I was watching the game on TV in South Bend.”

Any message from your uncle today about the division title?

“The cell coverage’s isn’t perfect right here in Candlestick. I’m sure I have some emails and text messages from people.”

Jed, the last time you talked to us in the locker room was after the last St. Louis game in St. Louis and then you fired your coach. Are you surprised yet, that it hasn't been that long since this then and this team has come a long way from that time?

"I had the flu that day, so that wasn't a real fun day for me. This time is a little bit better. I knew that we had talent on this team, and I've said that a lot. It's great to see it all come together."

How do you feel for somebody like Frank, that had a big day, that got a career record?

"To me this is such a great day for Frank. He's one of those guys that deserves to be up on that wall as one of the best players that has put on a 49ers uniform and unfortunately we haven't had the success on the field to make him really noticeable in that light. It's a great thing to have the first division in such a long time and show Frank to the world that he's gained the most yards out of any back in the history of the San Francisco 49ers. It's a great day for Frank."

Talk about Alex Smith Jed, and were you a believer when coach Harbaugh was looking to bring this guy back?

"I believe in coach and (Trent) and them being able to assess talent. That's what they're here to do. They're here to coach and assess talent. I know Alex. I know how hard he works. I know what a tough guy he is and I know what he can do. If coach believes in him, then I believe in coach and that's what we're doing."

Are you happy for Alex?

"I'm happy for everybody, not individually. I'm happy for the entire team. When you have coach Harbaugh here and somebody believes in your quarterback, I support our coach and he's been working with Alex like a coach should. Supporting his player and making sure he has every opportunity to be successful."

How does the organization go about making sure that people don't think this is the end?

"It's not the end and we're going to work tomorrow. We won (with) a nice score today. There's still a lot of plays that we missed out there. There's still a lot of things that we need to do to get better and that's what we have to instill in our guys. We haven't won anything yet. We're two games behind the conference leader right now. There's a long way to go if you want to be the number one seed. There's a lot of great teams in the NFC and you have to keep your head down and keep working everyday or else this doesn't mean anything."

What would it mean to you if you actually did go to the Super Bowl and win the Super Bowl?

"All we're worried about right now is Arizona. That's all we can do right now. We have to get better each week. We're just worried about Arizona."

Jed where did you watch the game? Were down on the field for most of it or were you up in a suite?

"I was back and forth, we had a check presentation to a charity board I am on, Tipping Point. Jimmy Johnson got his red 49ers Hall of Fame blazer today. It was a weird day for me. I'm usually in one spot, but I was going up and down a little bit today which was a little unnerving."

Where does this day fit into the 49ers landscape as far as accomplishments?

“Landscape? I don’t know if I can come up with a landscape analogy for you. It’s good. It’s a great win. Wanted to see how our team would come back after a tough loss on the road. They responded like mighty men. Thought it was a tremendous performance defensively. A real gem. We can start talking about the guys. [S] Dashon Goldson, thought he played extremely well in the secondary. Everybody else played really well, too. [S] Carlos [Rogers], [S Tarell] T. Brown, [S] Donte Whitner played extremely well. Up front, really good. Really good with [DT] Justin [Smith], [DT] Ray [McDonald], [LB] Aldon [Smith]. Played extremely strong. They pretty much define that, when you talk about strong guys. Was really pleased, really pleased. There’s things we did offensively that were really proud of as well. Moved the ball against a very tough defense. Thought [QB] Alex Smith played extremely well. Thought he had one of his best games. The receivers on the outside - Teddy [Ginn], Crab [Michael Crabtree], Kyle Williams, played extremely well in this game. [K] David Akers, I think he set a record for the franchise, so that was outstanding for us. Good team win.”

Is there anything you’d like to say about being division champions or would you rather not talk about that?

“It’s kind of a ‘celebrate all wins’ idea. Somebody asked earlier, ‘What were our plans if we won the division?’ (We) kind of lean more toward spontaneous celebration. Spontaneity. The guys are excited about it. They’re happy about it. They realize that there’s more out there for us. They’re already in there talking about that. They want to get everything that’s out there, everything that’s available, everything that could possibly come their way. We’ll keep going. Not Hollywood, but blue collar. That mentality.”

You didn’t look too thrilled by the Gatorade dump. Were you okay with that?

“I was fine with it. I’ve got my all-purpose black sweater. Don’t even need to change, it just rolls right off this thing. Incredible fabric.”

Have you worn the same sweater all year?

“Pretty much, yeah. It’s hot, cold, wet. This thing is like iron.”

Looking back over the past few months, at what point did you plant the seed in this team’s head that they could win the division?

“No, it’s been simple, but we’ve been trying to just get better. So we can get better today than we were yesterday. Better tomorrow than we are today. That’s been the mindset of this group.”

Do you have a LB Patrick Willis update?

“He had to come out of the game. He had a bit of a hammy. We’ll see where that is in the next couple of days.”

It sounded like they were celebrating in there. Do you want them to celebrate tonight, maybe even take a little while to enjoy what this was, this accomplishment?

“Like I said, we’re here. It’s spontaneous. Always talk about that whenever you win a game, it’s the six best hours that there is. It’s the best six hours that there is when you win a football game.”

But this just isn’t a game, it’s the first playoff spot since 2002.

“Yeah, and if that adds to it, that adds to it. Usually a win is a 10 out of 10 anyway. I don’t know how you get to 11 out of 10, but 10 out of 10 is 10 out of 10.”

You talked about facing a great defense. In the first half you were reduced to field goals. What did you tell them during halftime to make them come out and the offense just soar like they did?

“Offensively, it was not to get frustrated moving the ball. Just stay patient. We felt like we would make the plays when they were there. Didn’t want to get frustrated.”

You took several shots downfield. Alex took several shots downfield. How nice was it to finally get the connection with Crabtree?

“That felt really good. It was a great job by Michael running under the ball. Perfect throw from Alex. Great protection. It was just a well executed play. There were others, too. There were some other third downs that we picked up. Did a good job picking up third downs and moving the chains. I think there were a lot of positives. Wasn’t perfect, but things to get improvement from.”

Defensively, did you notice that the defense kind of rallied around itself, even though Patrick wasn’t out there, to go out for the shutout?

“Could be. I didn’t notice that specifically. I’m sure that was important to them. They might have been talking about that. This whole week has really been player driven. They knew what this was about. They knew what was at stake this week and what they would be up against. They knew they were going to have to bring their best game against this team and they embraced that.”

There are a number of guys in that room that went through a lot of years in frustration here, and now are able to celebrate. Can you get a picture of what it’s like for them? How did you convince those guys that went through these years of frustration, that they were guys who could also do this?

“It kind of comes back under why I talk about those guys as mighty men. They’ve gone through, each year that they’ve been here, thinking that was going to be the year. This is going to be the year that we go to the playoffs. Then they fight like heck every single week. It’s disappointment when you don’t make that. It’s a whole core group of them. I hate to start saying particular names because you’ll leave somebody out. All those guys. All those guys. It feels good for them. That us new guys, us first year guys on the team, could be a part of this and do that for them. This step. This game. Today. For all those strong, mighty men that have been carrying the flag for this many years.”

When you say it’s not Hollywood, what do you mean by that?

“I don’t think that’s what our team’s about. I don’t think it’s a Hollywood team. I think it’s a blue collar team.”

The head linesman, somebody shook his hand after he got you in that little thing with the Gatorade. What were they pretending with you about?

“They weren’t fighting. I thought they were coming over to get the red flag. It was at two minutes, they usually come over and tell you how many time outs you have at two minutes and take your red flag out of your pocket. It looked like they were up to something. I could see it in their eyes. That’s why I made a quick move to the left. Got hit with a glancing blow.”

RB Frank Gore also got the career 49ers record today. you’ve played in this league, you know how tough it is to get those yards. What are your thoughts about him at this point and that today?

“I hope by now it’s well documented how I feel about Frank Gore. I have the utmost respect for him as a person and as a player. It’s a powerful thing to set that kind of a record. Congratulations also to David Akers. But Frank in particular. The strength of the man. You start talking about some of the injuries he’s had. Injuries that would end the career of a lesser man. Shoulder, knee, hip. What it takes to genetically bounce back from that, mentally to bounce back from that and the physical rehab to bounce back from that. that’s all just strength. That’s strong will. There’s just so many other things, too. Just on a personal level with me, I worry about a lot of things. I think Frank noticed that this week. He came up to me probably half a dozen times and said “coach, we got this” and I believe him. I trusted him.”

Do you want to rest anyone? Would you like to rest anyone now that you guys have clinched? The next four weeks you have games that, they matter but they don’t matter any playoff positions?

“No, I don’t think we’re at any position to rest right now. We need all hands on deck. We’re going to get everything that’s out there for us and we could get. This is a time to build momentum, to improve, and to position ourselves the best way we possibly can. We’re really not in that position.”

What vibe was Frank giving you to sense you need a pep talk, like coach we’ve got this? What vibe were you giving to Frank to show you were worried?

“I don’t know. I don’t know. I really don’t know. To me, I don’t change. It’s just every minute, every hour of the day I’m trying to think of things to make this team great. There’s no change in that.”

I guess what Janie’s asking is do you worry about stuff during the week as the game approaches?

“Everything pretty much. I do.”

Kind of like fret about stuff?

“Yes.”

Maybe Frank was picking that up.

“Maybe. I’m moody and complicated. I know that. Frank just said “we got this” and I did feel better. Any time when it really becomes the players, when it’s the players that are driving it, the players are demanding things. How you practice. How you prepare. Emotionally getting ready. What you do in the meetings. Your disciplined to study. The more that’s coming from the players and the less it’s coming from the coach, the better off you’re going to be. The tighter

you're going to be as a team. I sense that in our team. I sense that team coming together like that."

To what degree is the normal coach fretting heightened when you play a team that the public says isn't that good? The Rams record isn't that good. To what degree?

"You look at the coaches, the players on the other side that you're playing and you can pretty much bet every single week that they're going to be good. This was no different. You see how the team plays and that team plays hard. They play all out. They're not going to give you an inch."

How about the emotion knowing that you are now in the playoffs?

"Yeah, it's the first step. We talked about it all week. Win the division. This is the first step that we had to do. Obviously, it hasn't been done around here I think in almost a decade. So, we've talked about it since I've been here and it's no different this year. Every team talks about it. Win your division and it's sweet to clinch it especially at home in front of the home fans. You had a great day. Got to see [RB] Frank [Gore] get the record and you clinch the division. So, yeah pretty sweet."

Pretty celebratory in there?

"Yeah absolutely, no question. I think the guys felt really happy. Guys celebrating in there. At the same time though I think all of us understand it's, like I said, just the first step. Still a lot of football ahead of us and got the ticket to the dance, still some other things in front of us still."

What did you see from WR Kyle Williams and that touchdown, he had and WR Michael Crabtree, the plays that they made for you today?

"Yeah, the guys outside are playing at a really high level, all three of those guys. Crabtree's been playing that way now I think for quite a few weeks. He's getting a lot of attention because of it. And those guys, [WR] Ted [Ginn Jr.] and Kyle are really stepping up. Ted played really well today. Kyle, we got pressure away, we hit that, knew he was going to get him in space, and certainly didn't expect him to house-call it, but he slipped inside, broke a tackle and that was it. And then Crabtree, great play on the deep ball. Just tracking it down and making the catch."

How did you feel just about the overall play on the offense, where you're at right now?

"Yeah, doing some good things. Had our struggles in the red zone. The game shouldn't even have been that close at halftime. I really felt like we could have done some better things to finish in the red zone. That's what stands out to me, we can always get better on third down. Had the production and then finally capitalized on it in the second half, but we let them hang around too long."

The things you and this whole team have been through for years, what's it like to leave the field with the stadium going crazy knowing there are games left to play, games in January?

“Yeah absolutely, it feels great. It’s what you work for. This team is so committed, so committed, as a group, coaches and players included in that. Everybody puts in so much time, takes so much pride in what we do and how we do it. The group in there has earned it. This isn’t any fluke or anything like that. It’s earned, every one of these victories and now we earned the division title.”

You made a tough decision, or it must have been a difficult decision to come back to this team at some point, does what you accomplished today make you all the more happy about the decision to stay?

“Yeah, loving where we’re at right now. Like I said though, there’s so much football ahead of us. When it’s all done I’ll be able to reflect on it a little bit. Right now, just loving the guys in the locker room, having a great time right now.”

Alex, what did you and Coach Harbaugh say after he got dumped by the Gatorade?

“I was joking with him about—I mean the guy’s so competitive he jukes the Gatorade dump. It like barely touched him. And I was giving him a hard time about that sweatshirt he always wears. It was like a shammy. The water didn’t even stick to it. It rolled off. But happy for him, he’s a guy that always shuns the praise and obviously it all starts with him, really coming in here and deserves obviously kind of the credit.”

You said he shuns the praise, but he very much embraced the idea that you celebrate this too?

“Yeah absolutely, yeah we’re not shying away from this. It’s no question, this is a milestone to get the division win, and we’re going to celebrate this today and tonight. And you know you have that window. That window where we’re going to enjoy it tonight and tomorrow morning, and then we’ll start to get ready for Arizona.”

Is that what you thought of how he would handle it, or how did you think he was going to handle this?

“Yeah, that’s what I kind of expected, no question. We talked about it all week. It’s a hat and T-shirt game. Had those sitting in there when we got in, and no question that he was going to leave it up to us. Let us celebrate how we wanted to celebrate, and guys are loving it. Guys have such a good time. The guys enjoy, everybody in that locker room enjoys being around each other and coming to work every day, and that’s what makes it so fun.”

Alex, you’d missed, the deep pass to Ted last week and it was called back, then the pass to TE Vernon Davis, you’ve been taking shots down the field and haven’t worked out, how satisfying was it to get one to Crabtree?

“Yeah, nice to finally hit the one to Michael and then obviously to have Kyle take that one all the way, no question. Yeah, but we’re leaving some stuff out there for sure. Especially that first half in the red zone as well. We missed the long ball to Vernon and then left some opportunities there in the red zone and really need to capitalize on them.”

Is there more concerted effort just to take shots down the field?

“It’s always been there. It’s always something we’ve talked about and tried to do. It’s just a matter of getting the opportunities, getting the call vs. the right looks. That also has to go with

shots. A lot of times there's a shot called, but if they aren't in the right defense I'm checking the ball down, or getting to something underneath. So, it all goes into that. But today was one of those days we were getting the looks and the way we were running the ball obviously presents problems and gave us some opportunities down the field to make plays."

I know you don't like to make comparisons, but have you ever had a game where you felt so in control of the offense and so accurate?

"Yeah, I felt really good out there today. I was seeing everything really well. We had some good stuff in the pass game, and I just feel really good with our group. Every week we just continue to work and work and work. And those guys outside they just put in so much time, receivers, tight ends, backs, all those skill position, especially in the pass game, just put in so much time. And I think it's just one of those things you just continue to take steps every week. So, no question I felt really good out there, I think everybody included, but especially me."

I’m sure they’ll be sore, so we’ll see what happens. [G] Jacob Bell did not go back in. It was his ankle, so I don’t know what we’re dealing with there. Then [QB] A.J. Feeley did something to his left thumb. He said right thumb, but I think it was his left. I don’t think it was his throwing hand. We’ll see how he is going forward. I’m obviously disappointed in the outcome of the game. I’ll address it right

now, because I know you want to know about the decision about [QB] Sam [Bradford]. Sam didn't practice all week. He was very sore all the way through and that had not changed. He was more than willing to give it a shot; I want you all to know that. It's just the kind of guy he is, but I just didn't think, [head athletic trainer] Reggie [Scott] and myself, did not think it's smart to take a chance if something worse would happen. The hope is with the extra day with the Monday night game coming up that he'll be healthy and be ready to go. [S] Darian Stewart didn't go as well. On the bright side a little bit, I did think the defense in the first half was pretty good. We controlled the line of scrimmage. They got some short fields and we toughed it out. The game got away from us in the third quarter on the defensive side of the ball and that one big play. We took a chance blitzing at the end there. But again, they win, we lose. ”

Did you think the 49ers defense would be this tough?

“No, I wasn't even aware of the stats for this game until I heard it on the radio. They played better than we did on that side of the football.”

When the offense has that much trouble staying on the field, does it decrease the margin of error for the defense?

“You're absolutely right. We felt that we were playing great defense in the first half, just giving up nine points. We felt pretty good going into that halftime. Then we came out and I still don't know exactly how it went, but I know somewhere in there that long pass came and that was tough to overcome. So I give credit, and I hope that [LB] Patrick Willis is okay. He's a good football player and we hate to see him hurt.”

Any update on [DE] Chris Long?

“Definitely Chris and Adam getting back in there, and Eugene and Justin — they're the epitome of what our team is about. It still doesn't change the win-loss column, I understand that, but there are guys that didn't practice all week and Chris was one of them.”

Did you have a view on that play by Feeley that was ruled a fumble?

“We thought it slipped out of his hand. Upstairs was telling us it was a fumble, so we didn't challenge it.”
