## San Francisco 49ers vs. Arizona Cardinals Game Notes Sunday, December 28, 2014

### *With the Win...*

- The **49ers** improved to 44-19-1 in the regular season under head coach **Jim Harbaugh**.
- The **49ers** improved to 29-18 against the Arizona Cardinals all-time.
- The **49ers** improved to 7-2 against the Cardinals in the regular season under **Harbaugh**.
- *Since 2011...*
  - The **49ers** improved to 15-8-1 against the NFC West.
  - The **49ers** improved to 33-14-1 vs. the NFC.
  - The **49ers** improved to 12-6 in the month of December.

### *Frank. Gore.*

- RB **Frank Gore** rushed for 144 yds. on 25 carries (5.8 avg.), marking his 4<sup>th</sup>, 100-yd. game of the season and the 39<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- **Gore** finished the season with 1,106 rushing yds., marking his 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive 1,000-yd. season and 8<sup>th</sup> of his career. He is one of only 11 players in NFL history to have at least 8, 1,000-yd. seasons in NFL history.

- With his performance today, **Gore** now has 11,073 rushing yds. in his career, becoming the 20<sup>th</sup> player in NFL history to surpass 11,000 yds. rushing. He also moved passed RB Warrick Dunn (10,967) for the 20<sup>th</sup>-most rushing yds. in NFL history.
- **Gore** is one of four players to rush for 11,000 yds. while playing their entire career with one team, joining Walter Payton, Barry Sanders and Jim Brown.
- **Gore** now has 39 career 100-yd. games, the 2<sup>nd</sup> most among all active players in the NFL.

### ***Bold Performance***

- WR **Anquan Boldin** caught a 76-yd. TD pass from QB **Colin Kaepernick**. It marked the 2<sup>nd</sup> longest recept. of his career and the longest since 9/14/08 vs. Mia., as a member of the Arizona Cardinals (79-yd. TD). It also marked his 5<sup>th</sup> TD recept. of the season and 70<sup>th</sup> TD recept. of his career.
- **Boldin** finished the season with 1,062 rec. yds. He became just the 4th player in franchise history to have multiple 1,000-yd. seasons with the 49ers (WR Jerry Rice – 12; WR Terrell Owens – 5; WR John Taylor – 2) and the first player to do so in his first two seasons with the team.

### ***Airing It Out***

- QB **Colin Kaepernick** completed 15 of 26 pass atts. for 204 yds., 2 TDs and a passer rating of 108.5. His 76-yd. TD pass to WR **Anquan Boldin** marked the 2<sup>nd</sup> longest completion of his career [80t – at StL (10/13/14)].
- The **49ers** improved to 15-1 when QB **Colin Kaepernick** records a passer rating of 100.0 or higher.

### ***Miller Time***

- FB **Bruce Miller** caught a 3-yd. TD pass from QB **Colin Kaepernick**. It marked his 2<sup>nd</sup> TD recept. of the season and 3<sup>rd</sup> of his career.

### ***Bringing The Heat***

- DT **Tank Carradine** brought down Cardinals QB Ryan Lindley for an 8-yd. loss. Carradine now has 3.0 sacks on the season.
- LB **Aaron Lynch** registered 1.0 sack of Cardinals QB Ryan Lindley. It marked his 6<sup>th</sup> sack of the season, the 2<sup>nd</sup> most sacks by a 49ers rookie LB since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

### ***Hands Team***

- LB **Michael Wilhoite** registered his second INT of the season, and his career, picking off a pass from Cardinals QB Ryan Lindley.
- CB **Chris Culliver** picked off Lindley in the 3<sup>rd</sup> qtr. It marked his 4<sup>th</sup> INT of the season and 7<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- S **Craig Dahl** registered a victory-sealing INT late in the 4<sup>th</sup> qtr. It marked his 1<sup>st</sup> INT of the season and 5<sup>th</sup> of his career.

### ***Big Boot***

- K **Phil Dawson** connected on 2 of 2 FG atts., from 53 yds. and 37 yds., respectively. Dawson has now made 25 FGs this season.
- **Dawson** has made 69.4 pct. (34 of 49) of his career FG atts. from 50-yds.-or-more, ranking 4<sup>th</sup> in NFL history [K Matt Prater - 75.0 (24 of 32); K Jeff Wilkins – 72.2 (26 of 36); K Rob Bironas – 70.6 (24 of 34)] (min. 20 made).

**S Craig Dahl gave you the ball he intercepted and you carried that off the field. What does that gesture mean to you?**

“It just meant a lot. Much appreciated. Just the way I feel about these players, these coaches, this staff, this organization. Been the time of my life. Been a lot of great memories, great moments.”

**Do you expect to be the next coach at Michigan?**

“There will be announcements made concerning those things. I want to really focus and concentrate on how much I appreciate you too, appreciate the fans, media, the people that I mentioned in terms of our football team. Great allies, great friends and people I’m going to be friends with forever. That’s the way I feel about them. The things that were accomplished here were very, very good.”

**You had a discussion with CEO Jed York before the game. Was that just to say goodbye? What was that conversation generally about?**

“That was a pregame talk. Personal, really.”

**Is there a sadness after four years of being here and doing the things you did? On this day, does it feel, is it a sad moment for you?**

“I don’t know how to say it. I maybe don’t have the words for it. I’ll say it this way: as I’ve said along, you work at the pleasure of the organization. It’s been a tremendous four years. And it’s been a pleasure to work and serve for this organization, for these players, for this football team. I feel great about what we’ve accomplished. Feel great about the friendships that were made, the relationships that were made. That’s what a team is – a set of relationships. I feel good.”

**You’ve said recently your number one priority as a head coach is to win football games. You did a lot of that in four years. Do you leave here feeling, like, short of the Lombardi Trophy, that you accomplished everything you could have?**

“I thought we accomplished great things. Tremendous football. So many people to thank for that. So many people worked so hard to construct where this football team is. Feel great to be a part of it. Feel it’s been signature years in my life and I have much gratitude for everyone involved.”

**So from what you’re saying, did you coach your last game as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers today?**

“There’s going to be statements made. I know that the organization has a statement that they want to release, so I will defer to that.”

**Can you share at all what you told the team about what will happen?**

“Yeah, just how much I appreciate them, just how much I love them.”

**Do you know about anything that will happen or did you address that part of it?**

“We addressed. We addressed.”

**Will you be here tomorrow for your weekly news conference?**

“We’ll see, we’ll see. We’ll think about that [laughter].”

**I was thinking of being here. And it would be nice if you were here.**

“Let’s get together. Let’s do that. That would be fantastic.”

**Do you leave on good terms with Jed York and general manager Trent Baalke?**

“Yes. Yes. As I said, everybody. As I described it, this has been the time of my life. That song, “Had the Time of My Life.” I did [laughter]. I really did. I had a lot of fun. It’s the relationships that were made along the way. That’s what a team is. And I appreciate the fans, the people of the Bay Area, the 49er Faithful. All the good times that we’ve had. The other, the relationships that we’ve had. I think it’s been really good and fantastic. Players, coaches, staff, friends for life.”

**Is this your choice to move on or is this their choice?**

“As I said, you work at the pleasure of the organization. That’s what we all do.”

**Was this your ideal way for RB Frank Gore to finish out this -- ?**

“Thank you. Yes, let’s talk about Frank Gore. Wow. Again, I’m not going to have the words for it but what an unwavering competitor. Frank Gore will have another year of football next year there’s no question about that. Tremendous season, tremendous character and football player. There is a football heaven that’s awaiting Frank Gore and so many of our players: [DT] Justin Smith, [QB] Colin Kaepernick, [FB] Bruce Miller, there’s so many of them. [WR] Michael Crabtree, [WR] Anquan Boldin, [S] Antoine Bethea, [CB] Chris Culliver. What a great game for Chris Culliver today, too. So many of them. Whether the relationship was four years or just a couple weeks, I was incredibly close to this team. I’ll forever appreciate that. And forever proud. Forever proud to have been a part of this, been a part of this football team.”

**Was this a tough season for you overall, though, just given everything you had to deal with?**

“We battled. We battles. The team battled from beginning to the end. That’s what you do. You start something, you finish it. I felt like all of our guys, I feel like this way: You do your best. If you do something, people may look at it as not good enough, but you do your best. If your best isn’t appreciated, then you do your best anyway. And I think that’s what our football team did this year.”

**Do you think you were appreciated this year?**

“Yes. I have so much gratitude because of so many things that’s given. The respect that the players have always shown. The way they’ve always given it their very best. That’s all you can ask. And you know, I’ve said it many times, it’s a joy to coach this team.”

**When was your last Gatorade shower before this? Do you remember? Was it Atlanta? You don’t remember? Green Bay?**

“2011, maybe.”

**Do you think you’re going to miss the NFL? You talk about the great players you’ve coached. Are you going to miss the NFL in any way?**

“Is the NFL going somewhere? [Laughter] But Frank Gore. Back to Frank Gore [laughter]. What a performance. I think the thing that’s really burning in my mind right now is that run along the sidelines straining to stay in bounds. Everything he had. Every ounce of football energy. That’s him. That’s who he is. He’s a known agent and trusted friend.”

**Do you expect to or hope to be coaching alongside of your current assistant coaches next year?**

“I don’t know what the paths are right now in regard to that. Assistant coaches, our staff, I can’t thank them enough. You talk about the work that people do and the effort that they give and the relationships that are made, it’s strong, strong friendships and strong allies.”

**How important was it to go out with the win today? You and former 49ers head coach George Seifert are the only 49er coaches to never have a losing season.**

"It felt great to win. Feel good about ourselves. The thing is, I count them up. I count up these wins and that's 49 wins and that seems appropriate. That seems pretty darn good."

**How do you think this organization stands moving into the future? How do you leave it?**

"It's one of the elite, premier franchises in the NFL. Proud to have been a part of it."

**What will be the most memorable moment of your career with the 49ers?**

"That's a great question. There's so many. I just keep thinking of the relationships. Keep thinking of the friendships. I'll be forever proud to call these men friends."

**What would you like to put in the 49ers museum to represent the four years you were here? What would you like to have in there for the public see?**

"I haven't thought of that. Do you have an idea?"

**Khakis.**

"Khakis?"

**Going into the season, realistically, did you have an inkling this was going to be your last season with the 49ers?**

"No. As you know, all the focus was on achieving our goals, winning the next game. All the focus was at all times on that."

**WR Anquan Boldin has had back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. How much of a value has he been for you since you've been here?**

"There's probably a football hell, but I really believe there's a football heaven and that's where a guy like Anquan Boldin is going. Tremendous, tremendous person and football player. Just great to see another stalwart performance from Anquan Boldin. Forever proud to even know him. Forever proud to have coached him, to have been on the same team with a man like Anquan Boldin."

**Do you have any regrets about your time here?**

"Not that I can think of, no. Feel good."

**Did you have a chance to say goodbye to the players in the locker room or will that be done tomorrow? How are you going to handle that?**

"We had a good discussion in the locker room. Again, feel like I'm going to be friends for life with anybody that wants to be because I truly love this team."

**You once said that playing for a Lombardi Trophy, Super Bowl title, is the ultimate prize. You don't have that yet. How do you reconcile that in your mind? Is it that still out there for you to do? For Jim Harbaugh to do, to accomplish?**

"We played for it. And that's the way we looked at it every time we took the field. Been a tremendous thrill. One of the great thrills of my life. Be forever proud of what we accomplished."

**How has this organization changed you, helped you grow?**

"Been a lot of growth. When you talk about the people that are in our organization, on our team, players you're showered with, coaches you're showered with so many attributes, so many things that are right and good, whether it's work ethic or leadership. It's an example. It serves as an example. Daily, you're showered with it. I know I've grown immensely."

**You talk about all the good things here, so why is this ending? Why?**

"I think I addressed that earlier. Let's talk to the players."

**Why did it end 8-8 this year than a better record, in your opinion? What happened?**

“Like I said, everybody gave it their very best. And I appreciate that, and respect that and will be forever proud to have been associated with these men and their best.”

**What’s the most important thing you’re looking for in your next job?**

“I think we’ve covered as much ground as we can cover right now, but I appreciate you, appreciate you all and our friendship.”

**What kind of emotions are going through you now knowing that you guys [inaudible]?**

“It’s bittersweet. Happy we got the win. Happy we were able to get [RB] Frank [Gore] and [WR] Anquan [Boldin] to their milestones and get this win. But [head] coach [Jim] Harbaugh’s the coach that drafted me. He’s the coach that chose to start me. He’s the coach that stood behind me through everything.”

**Does Harbaugh leaving make you wonder what’s next for you? He’s been such a big part of your career.**

“He has been a huge part, but I’m playing football regardless. I’m the quarterback for the San Francisco 49ers until they tell me different. So, I’m going to keep trucking on. Be looking forward to finding out who they’re going to bring in and what we’re going to be working on. But, as far as me, I’m going to continue to work.”

**The past couple weeks, you’ve mentioned that just the idea of Jim Harbaugh not being here next year was something that you had a hard time wrapping your mind around. Did you get a chance to talk to management or ownership to kind of find out why or are you curious why he’s not here?**

“That’s not my job position. That’s not in my job description. I’m here to play football. I love coach Harbaugh, I support him, but this isn’t my place to make that decision or comment on that.”

**How difficult has this been, though, with this season with all these questions that have swirling really since the start of the season? Your job is to shut it out and just play football, but was it difficult?**

“No. What was difficult was having so many injuries. That was the most difficult thing going through the season. We looked out on defense today and said, ‘Man, we have four of our normal starters out there.’ That’s tough to win football games when you have that many players out. And hats off to everybody that stepped up and played for us because they helped us get that win today.”

**It’s often said that you learn the most about yourself when facing adversity. What did you learn after this season?**

“That you have to be on top of everything, every detail, whether you’re a starter, backup, third-string, it doesn’t matter. You have to be on top of everything because you could be playing at any moment.”

**Do you feel more comfortable running the ball? You look like you’re having a great time out there and that pretty much seems like your style of play.**

“Whatever the offense dictates to allow me to do and allow this offense to do to win games, I’m going to do that.”



**How emotional was that last meeting with Harbaugh? Just talking to you guys in that locker room after this game.**

"I think it was huge. A lot of us have been with coach Harbaugh since he's been here. And the players that were here before him saw how he turned things around and turned this organization back into a winning one. It's tough to let that go, but at the same time, we have to keep moving forward as players because our careers keep going on."

**Do you have a relationship with defensive line coach Jim Tomsula? Do you know him very well?**

"Yeah, I think he's a great guy."

**How did coach Harbaugh help you develop as a player or as a person over the last few years?**

"He's done numerous things for me, not only as a quarterback, but as a person. I think he's not only a great coach, but a great person and that's what he preaches to the team. Go out, give everything you have to your team, but make sure you're taking care of your family and you're taking care of your teammates and those are the things that are important."

**Since you took over as quarterback, Jim was always supportive and positive about you when answering questions from us, unfailingly. Behind the scenes, how did he treat you?**

"We have a great relationship. He's going to tell you if you're doing something wrong, if you need to adjust something or change something. He's going to let you know. I think that's where the respect came between us was yes, we have a great relationship, but you're still my coach and I still need you and you still need to point out what I'm doing wrong and make sure I'm still improving."

**You mentioned the injuries, but was there another reason that the 49ers, particularly the offense, weren't able to produce more yards and more points this year now that it's over?**

"Being on the details. Once again, offense comes down to execution and if you miss a block here or if you don't make a throw here or you make a wrong cut, those plays don't work. And not being on top of those small things are what hurt us this year."

**You were sacked 52 times this year, you had some ups and downs. Where would you say your confidence level is as this franchise quarterback?**

"My confidence isn't going to change. I'm going out to play and play to win. I think I'm fully capable to go out and help this organization and this team get wins every Sunday. What happens on the field isn't going to change what I think of my abilities and my teammates' abilities to go out and win games."

**[Inaudible]**

"Most definitely."

**This could've been your last game with Frank. Can you just talk about what he's meant to your career?**

"Frank is, I mean he's been huge to my career. Not only as a running back and taking pressure off of the passing game with the way he runs the football, but in the passing game, protection, keeping my jersey clean. He does everything we've asked of him and more and he does it without question and I think that's why everyone was so excited to see him get that thousand yards today and see him get the 11,000 for his career because he comes to work everyday. It would've been very easy for him not to play last week coming off a concussion. He comes out and plays and has over 150 yards. That says a lot to the man he is and the character he has."

**As CSN Bay Area reporter Matt Maiocco mentioned, no matter what we've asked Harbaugh about you, and sometimes our questions have been pointed, said, 'Hey, look at the stats, he didn't have a real good game,' he's never been critical of you. Maybe he said, 'Colin didn't have**

**his best game.' What has that meant to you? The fact that he hasn't come close to ever throwing you under the bus.**

"It's huge when you have support of a coach like that. It gives me confidence to go out and put everything on the line. It might not be my best game or it might be my best game, but he's going to support me regardless. To have that confidence when you step on the field that your coach is behind you and your team's behind you is huge."

**Did he have just a little extra oomph today before the game when you guys were hitting shoulders and pads before the game? You and coach.**

"Yeah, we wanted to make sure today was a good one, that we went out the right way. We knew this was a possibility and we wanted to make sure we laid it all out on the line for coach."

**Think you might become a Michigan fan?**

"I'll always be a fan of coach Harbaugh. Not too sure about Michigan though."

**Was it weird, bitter-sweet emotionally knowing that head coach Jim Harbaugh won't be here?**

"Definitely weird. He had a lot to do with me re-signing back to the team. So, it's definitely weird. For me, it's something that you didn't see coming especially with what he had done in previous years. I mean, unprecedented, first three years that you go to at least the NFC Championship. So, definitely didn't see that coming."

**Does it change where you stand with the team that he's not going to be here? Does it change your view?**

"No. I mean, I'm under contract."

**Do you even understand what happened? We're on the outside looking in. He's been a very successful coach. I don't understand what's going on. Do the players? Do you?**

"No. But, we don't make those decisions. So, you're asking the wrong guy about that. If it was my decision he would be here. But, obviously not. It's not my decision."

**You said you re-signed because of him. What was it about his coaching style that made you re-sign?**

"Me and him had a connection. I just liked the way that he goes about his business. The same way that I do. No nonsense type guy. Loves to win. Loves to compete. You see it in the way that he comes to work every day. The guy loves the game of football. I believe if he still could play he would probably be out there. You can see that. So, that had a lot to do with, like I said, me signing back here."

**What's your thoughts on next year?**

"Like I said earlier, I'm still under contract."

**There's four receivers in 49ers history that have multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons. What does that mean to you to join a list of former 49ers WR Jerry Rice and those likes?**

"To be honest with you, it doesn't mean much to me. I'm not a numbers guy, stats guy. I don't play for that. I play for one reason and that's to win championships."

**How about just seeing RB Frank Gore reach 1,000 yards? Could you tell that maybe that meant something to him?**

“Definitely. Especially with the uncertainty of not knowing if he’ll be back. I think it was huge for him. We all wanted it for him. We wanted to make sure that he got it. I think it’s a big milestone. Frank is a guy that he leaves his all out on the field. So, it would be a shame to not have him go out the right way.”

**How would you describe the season? Was it disappointing, frustrating?**

“Anytime you don’t win a championship it’s disappointing. Like I said, that’s the reason that I play the game. That’s the reason I play so hard. Every time I step on the field every year I feel like I’m supposed to win a championship. So, anytime I fall short of that is definitely disappointing.”

**Looking at your offense this year, looking back, would you have rather had done it differently? T Anthony Davis was saying maybe more power-running, that sort of thing?**

“For us, I don’t think you can sit back and second guess what coaches did. Coaches coach, players play. Players play better we win a lot more games. So, you can’t sit here and point the fingers at the coaches. I don’t think that helps any of us. It definitely doesn’t help us win. Whatever a coach calls I was always taught even in high school as a young kid whatever a coach calls you make it work and that’s your job as a player.”

**QB Colin Kaepernick’s had a pretty rough year, especially from previous year’s standards. What do you see from him going forward, the same high hopes?**

“I see him working his butt off. I don’t expect anything else different from him. This year hasn’t been his best year numbers wise. So, I definitely expect him to work his butt off this offseason, go back to the drawing board, find all the things that he needs to correct and I think he’ll work tirelessly trying to correct those things.”

**Any personal highlights for this year for you when you look back?**

“I mean, for me, I’ve been in this league. This is my 12th year. So, I’ve only won one championship, played in two Super Bowls. So, I understand that not every year is going to be that year. “Obviously, not the outcome we were looking for. I thought that guys played extremely hard. But we killed ourselves in critical situations. We’ve had problems now two weeks in a row with quarterbacks breaking out on scrambles for long runs that end up in points. We’ve got to get that stopped obviously because we’re going to play another one next week. Offensively, I thought we did a good enough job to win this game, other than the turnover that might’ve been a long field goal. But the last one, we should never give up a sack in that situation to start that drive and put [QB] Ryan [Lindley] in that situation. But I thought Ryan played extremely well for us, well enough for us to win the ball game. We’ve got to do other things in the kicking game. We got a big return called back. We don’t have to play perfect, but we have to play much better around him. I don’t have anything on [QB] Drew [Stanton] other than he’s exactly where we thought he was last week. We’re hoping he’s able to play this week and we’ll see. Obviously, we’re much more comfortable with Ryan after his performance today and look forward to the challenge.”

**How much of a problem has it been these last two weeks that a defense that’s been able to force turnovers all year hasn’t been able to?**

“They’ve been huge. We’re not getting any short fields either, through the return game. We had that one called back. Or turnovers. We’re having to go the length of the field too often. We haven’t won the turnover battle in a while. In these critical games, especially on the road in the playoffs, they’re going to be huge.”

**Can you talk about your defense against the run?**

“We tackled poorly again today. All it takes is one guy in a gap to miss a tackle and it’s going to be a squirter. With Carolina, who we’re probably going to end up playing with their rushing attack, it’s going to be a challenge for us again. It’s going to be three weeks in a row with the same style and hopefully we’ve learned from it.”

**How did Ryan get to that point where he played with such poise today?**

“He didn’t play poorly last week. It was a huge stage, the biggest stage maybe in Cardinal history in the regular season. And he threw one pick late in the game. Mike [WR Michael Floyd] made big plays for him today. We dropped a big ball in the fourth quarter on third down and that was a first down. Smokey [WR John Brown] can’t let them knock that ball out of his hand when we have a first down and we’re going in for a field goal. Those are the things you have to keep learning from. Ryan was very cool last week and I thought he was extremely poised and knew his game plan today. And that situation that happened on Wednesday was my fault. I should’ve kept my mouth shut. I knew what I was going to do anyway.”

**How important was it to keep things short for him early on?**

“That’s just the game plan. The second play, we took a shot. That was a great throw on the bootleg and there was just one pass at the start of the game that was a short pass.”

**The interception, the second one. Was that a miscommunication with him and Smokey? Do you know what happened on that?**

“That was just a bad play. He had a double move on and basically, Ryan shouldn’t have been on that side of the field. He should’ve been on the other side of the field.”

**Getting back to the defense, what do you think has to happen to defend quarterbacks better when they scramble because you’re going to see another one?**

“We have to do a better job of containing them in our rush lanes. We can’t rush out here and shoot another gap and leaving it open in man-to-man coverage.”

**Was it a factor not having [LB] Larry Foote and having the younger guys in there?**

“It led to some of the runs because Larry was on the sidelines. He was calling them out. He knew what was coming and we got out of our gaps a couple of times.”

**How do you reset the table now looking ahead to the playoffs?**

“This whole season is over. It’s a whole new one. I told them I don’t want anyone moping on the plane. It’s 0-0 and we’re in the tournament. We’ve got some things to learn from. We’ve got a short week. We’ll be at the office Tuesday getting ready for this playoff game. We’re not planning on being one and done.”

**It seemed Michael Floyd really helped out Ryan and had a good game. What did you think of his performance?**

“That’s the way he’s supposed to play. He has the ability to make those plays. He made some great ones today.”

**How would you assess your overall performance?**

“You know, there are things that I’m probably going to look back at and be really happy with. I felt the most comfortable I’ve felt out on the field probably since I’ve been in the NFL. But, there’s still a handful of plays that kill you. That’s what the NFL’s about, playing consistently. If those five or six plays are on a third down or on a crucial drive, then it’s a turnover. It kills you.”

**The picks you did have, was there a common thread there or a takeaway?**

“I’m always super hard on myself. There were just all kinds of bonehead plays on my part, bonehead decisions. The one to Smokey [WR John Brown] is completely on me. The one to [RB] Robert [Hughes], I forced it in. I just have to throw it away and kick a field goal. Then the last one was probably just trying to rush to make a play. You know when you’re in the two-minute drill and you get sacked it’s never a good start, so you want to try to get a chunk back, especially with what we were looking at time-wise. So, just forced one in. The good thing is it’s all stuff I can learn from. I know right now, even before looking at the film, what I did wrong. We’ll correct it and get ready to roll next week.”

**If you have to play next week, do you feel like this offense and you are in a much better place than you were a couple weeks ago?**

“No question. I feel night and day. I mean, it’s a loss, and no one wants to lose in the NFL, but I think we gained some confidence, not only with the way we ran the ball a lot better this week. We did a great job in pass protection again. I told those guys that besides there at the end, I didn’t get a whole lot of

pressure. We did good. I thought the receivers caught the ball – [WR] Mike Floyd had a great day, and if he comes to play like that then it's going to be tough for guys on the outside to stop him.”

**You were much more efficient on third down; hot read to WR Tedd Ginn, Jr. early, some of the big plays to WR John Brown, WR Larry Fitzgerald and WR Michael Floyd. What was the difference from last week to this week?**

“It was just being decisive. That was the biggest thing, and then being smart with where we were going with the football. I think at times last week I tried to force things in there and make plays where there weren't plays. That's the brilliant part of football, the coaches draw up game plans and they put you in a position to win, so you don't need to force anything. They're usually going to find a way to get somebody open.”
